Basic Rules for Campers

- Be positive and respectful
- No inappropriate language
- Children must have shoes on at all times
- No sharing of food, drinks or money
- Please remember to always clean up after yourself
- Please Listen to Counselors!
- Please always have a safe body and respect the personal space of other campers and the counselors.
- No throwing of any objects

Above all else, **TREAT OTHERS THE WAY YOU WANT TO BE TREATED!**!

Campers will be briefed on basic camp rules on Monday mornings. This is usually done as new campers sign up weekly. Discipline will be at the discretion of the camp staff.

Cell Phones

The camp's policy is that all cell phones should be left at home. If you feel it necessary for your child to have their cell phone, it must always be in their bag/backpack at all times. Children need to ask permission from the staff in the event they need to use their phone.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Please note that for certain activities, children may be grouped by age.
- On days when there will be a water activity, campers should arrive with sunscreen (already applied), a towel, a change of clothes and swimwear
- Children should not be dropped off a camp before 8:45 am.
- Children will not be allowed to play around or on the parking lot surface for safety reasons.
- We will have a Lost and Found.

Sign Out Release/Late Pick Up Policy

Each camper will be required to provide the names of those authorized for pick up. Only those listed on the registration form will be allowed to pick up children, with proper identification.

While we understand traffic issues, car issues, etc. it is important to note that camp ends at 11:30 am. Any child not picked up by 11:45 will be considered a late pick up. Campers will be permitted one late pick-up per session. Should the lateness problem persist, staff will contact the District Manager for further action.

Medical Information

Staff members are prohibited from dispensing any type of medication!

If your child requires medication while at camp, this must be noted on the registration form.

Please note all specifics regarding medications and their proper administration.

The medications should be brought to camp in a labeled prescription bottle.

Please keep the medication in your child's bag, SEALED at all times.

Epi Pen Policy

All children who require an EPI-PEN MUST have it with them each and every day of camp!. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to be sure that you child comes to camp with EPI-PEN. This is for safety reasons and in the best interest of your child. EPI-PENS must be stored in a container with your child's name on it. The staff will keep the container (and EPI-PEN) at the designated staff table.

Staff members have been trained in basic first aid for scrapes, bumps and bruises. In the best interest and health of campers, staff will call 911 for instances beyond the scope of their training.
